Statement of historical significance and description of property:

B888

The trestle is heavy wood beam construction, 4 stories tall. One story has repeated patterns of five round heavy poles, the middle one vertical. The two to each side leaning toward it.

There are two support rafters under each set of heavy poles.

The bridge proper is made of railroad ties of varying length. "734.58" marked on each diagonal on north side of entranceway. There is a metal guard for the walks on top of structure.

The railroad was built through to McMinnville in 1879 and the trestle which originally supported the tracks over the Cozine would have been constructed that year.
