The following is a list of information required for <u>Interior Residential Remodel:</u>

New Sidewalk and Driveway Standards may apply to all new construction and remodels in order to meet current ADA Standards as shown in the PROWAG Design Guidelines (Sept. 2012). An evaluation of the existing sanitary sewer system (onsite) for defects as part of the City's I&I Program may also be required.

2 complete sets of construction drawings with the following:

NOTE: You may find that your particular project does not involve some of the following required items. Please choose those items from the list that DO pertain to your project.

Scale should be indicated on each type of drawing.

Please note square footages.

Floor plans should include:

Dimensions of rooms, stairs/landings, size of headers, and beams.

Window sizes and sill heights

Room names and use

Locate beam & header bearing points

Framing connection specifications (nailing)

Size & direction of floor joists

All plumbing fixtures, as well as furnace and water heater (indicate fuel type)

Attic and crawl access

Smoke detectors (interconnected with each floor level)

Cross section indicators

Door sizes

Location of firewalls

Insulation values for walls, floors, ceilings.

U-values of windows, skylights, and exterior doors.

Cross section of walls and floor system

Design calculations if bearing walls are moved and location and cross section of new foundation.

ASBESTOS REMOVAL REQUIREMENTS

The Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) has requirements regarding asbestos removal. An inspection (survey) must be performed BEFORE any demolition or renovation activities begin to determine the presence of asbestos-containing materials. A survey must be performed by an accredited inspector. If there is asbestos-containing material, various options are available.

DEQ defines a <u>demolition</u> as "wrecking that involves the removal of load-supporting members and/or intentional burning." <u>Renovation</u> is defined as "altering in any way one or more facility components that does not involve removing a load-supporting member."
