## 1 Description

Two scenarios for radiological incidents have been identified. The first would be the result of a transportation or industrial accident involving the release of radioactive materials. The second, however remote the possibility, would be the intentional or unintentional detonation of a nuclear bomb or radiological dispersion device.

### 1.1 Transportation and/or Industrial Accident

If a transportation or industrial incident involves radioactive materials, it would be treated as a hazardous materials incident, and fire would be the lead agency. (See IA 2 – Hazardous Materials)

### 1.2 Nuclear Attack/Radiological dispersion Device

The City of McMinnville is not equipped to respond to a nuclear attack or Radiological Dispersion Device and would look to a higher government authority, such as the County, for direction on response activities and population protection measures.

The City will establish a local Emergency Operations Center and Command structure sufficient to provide an interface to the County. The response roles of the City will be the close coordination of public information dissemination, provide available resources to the response and management of the incident, and possibly evacuation or in-place sheltering.

If the incident was of the magnitude that required evacuation of the entire City, a local EOC and Command organization would not be maintained.
