## Background:

On August 6, 2020 MacPac heard from Parks & Recreation staff regarding their recommendations for size and scope of 17 different amenity spaces to be housed in one multipurpose recreation facility. Recommendations made by staff were in some cases modified from the original recommendations made by the consulting group (Ballard\*King) in the <a href="Phase I">Phase I</a> report (pg 55-59).

MacPac members were asked to complete a survey regarding the recommendations made by staff and provide comment on each of the 17 described amenity spaces. MacPac recommendations and comments are noted in the chart below.

The numbers found in the left column of the table below (items 1-17) correlate with the numbers found on pages 55-59 of the phase I report.
