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Statement of historical significance and description of property:

A356

(Buckeye Street is in the sidewalk on the Sixth Street side)

This home faces east. It has two entrances, one on the east side and another on the north side. It is a two-story home with a basement. The exterior finish is stucco. There is a wooden water table on a second floor belt course.

The windows are one-over-one, double hung sash of various sizes. The roof is a bell cast gable with decorated verge board.

The second floor has vertical boards visible in haft timber styling. The front porch is a three-fourths wrap-around supported by boxed pillars on concrete bases. The porch has concrete steps and wooden decking.

There is a detached carport.

The outside chimney on the south side is enclosed within the dormer, runs between sixover-six double-hung windows.

The south-facing shed dormer encloses six stationery windows in groups of three. A three-foot square exterior niche is on the east wall.

Frank Rogers, son of pioneer James Rogers, and one of the partners in McMinnville's oldest pharmacy, (Roger's Bros. Pharmacy, established in the 1870's and still in business), built this house in 1912 after moving his original has to another site on 8<sup>th</sup> and Cowls, McMinnville. He and his wife, Nellie, lived here until death. The present owner is their daughter.
