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Statement of historical significance and description of property:

A467

The Presbyterian Church was founded on the corner of Second and Davis in 1851. Two previous churches burned. Southeast part of wood building was erected in 1897. The building has been turned and the northeast corner (now the sanctuary) was added in 1909.

The original building had a brick foundation-now covered with cement. There is a complete cement basement under the northeast and southeast portions of the church. The roof is asbestos shingles. The roof is gabled except for one side which is hipped. There are corner brackets on the old building.

Window treatment is triangular shaped. Decorative stained glass, three-over-three, two-lighted pivotal, and single lights.

There is an off-center main entrance in the tower with corbelled cap. There is a cement stairway. Two exterior chimneys. Cement steps leading to two cellar entrances, one with arched entry.

New education and fellowship hall was built in 1968 with cement foundation and stucco and brick exterior. Asbestos shingles on a low gable roof. The new addition is separated by a courtyard attractively landscaped with metal sculptured waterfall. There are plans to add another office to this section. The old building is in need of repair from the basement up.

Planning for a new church building began Jan. 1909, plan received in July, cornerstone laid Sept. 1909. Materials: Dayton brick trimmed w/Willamina pressed bricks (approximate cost including furnishings \$11,000).

Rogers memorial Pige Oregon installed (\$2,000) 4/22/1918 – Telephone Register.
