Sealed bids for the **BIOSOLIDS APPLICATION PROJECT, Project No. 2019-1** will be received by Larry Sherwood, Project Manager, at the Community Development Department, **231 Northeast Fifth Street**, **McMinnville, Oregon 97128, until the bid closing time of 2:00 p.m., on the 14th day of March 2019**, at which time the bids will be publicly opened and read. Bidders whose bids are received after the stated times will be considered non-responsive and their bids will not be considered.

The scope of work being considered will consist of hauling liquid biosolids from the City's Water Reclamation Facility and land application to surrounding farms. The estimated quantity to be hauled from the 2.83 million gallon storage tank located at 3500 NE Clearwater Drive, McMinnville, Oregon, and then land applied, is 4,500,000 gallons per year. The anticipated notice to proceed for the project work is July 1, 2019.

The City reserves the right to reject any and all bids, to waive any irregularities, and to accept the bid deemed in the best interest of the City. The City may reject any bid not in compliance with all prescribed public bidding procedures and requirements, and may reject for good cause any or all bids upon a finding by the City that it is in the public interest to do so.
