
Purpose of the PROS Plan

1999 PROS Plan

- \$9 Million parks bond (2000)
- Grant funding
- 50% increase in developed park land
- New linear pathways
- Park renovations








Are there any changes you'd like to see to regarding your partnership with the City and the parks, recreation and open space system?

Potential for large events/ outdoor amphitheater

Downtown beautification would require expanded responsibilities

Stress from outside visitorship - more than Downtown Assoc can handle

Resources to provide construct. operate, maintain

Take best care of what we have first, then continue to build and grow parks system

Sports tourism - fits multiple community needs

Listening sessions - heard about desire for space 8 opportunities to play sports (Soccer, baseball) Equity issues who has opportunities, access to what's available Linfield campus is open - safe boundary is issue. Student safety is priority

Quarry Park exploring opportunity, grant funding. In dense residential. forested land.

Trails - less expensive to build and maintain

Mountain biking parks, high school program, Linfield grant?

Contracts/MOU with City - school district, Visit McMinnville. Chemeketa?




How are you connected to McMinnville?




