Ordinance No. 5165

Purpose: Revises Chapter 17.57 "Landscaping" and Chapter 17.58 "Trees" of the McMinnville Municipal Code (MMC).

Phase 2 of Comprehensive Landscape Code Amendment

Updates:

- Landscaping purpose and intent
- Applicability
- Design and implementation standards
- Streamlined Street Tree Plan review processes



Why this matters?

- Align development with community priorities
- Establish clear and predictable standards for applicants, which streamlines the development process
- Optimize staff capacity by reducing required number of reviews and inspections.
- Contribute to a safer, more visually appealing urban environment across McMinnville

Ordinance Modification

- By request of MAC W&L.
- Add "Safety" to Section 17.57.070(B)(8)

Demonstrate that landscaping meets minimum National Electric <u>Safety</u> Code and Water and Light Commission rules for clearance from electric meters, utility poles, street lights, transformers, and other electric facilities.



Actions

Per Section 17.72.130(B)(2) of the McMinnville Municipal Code:

Upon receipt of the decision of the Planning Commission, the City Council shall:

- a. <u>Adopt an ordinance</u> effecting the proposed change as <u>submitted by the Planning Commission</u>, or
- b. <u>Adopt an ordinance</u> effecting the proposed change <u>in an amended form</u>, or
- c. Refuse to adopt the amendment through a vote to deny, or
- d. <u>Call for a public hearing on the proposal</u>, subject to the notice requirements stated in Section 17.72.120(D).

Section 17.57.010

Proposed Modification:

 Groundwater protection, climate resilience, air quality, and tree preservation

Reason:

 Aligns with Landscape Review Committee and **Planning** Commission goals



Applicability

17.57.030 – Zones Requiring Landscaping

Proposed Modification:

- Adds R-5 zone
- Corrects R-4 zone title

Reason:

 Improves clarity and consistency with other city codes

17.57.040 - Applicability

Rename section clarifies scope and intent to "Applicability" Apply standards to all non-residential ensures consistency uses in residential zones Clarify standards for Manufactured confirms existing applicability **Dwelling Parks** and satellite dishes City projects: review only approved adds flexibility, reduces staff workload landscape plan elements



Applicability

17.57.040 - Applicability

Exempt projects in the public right-ofway

recognizes state law and practical limitations

Exempt middle housing projects (still under Ch. 17.11)

simplifies review, aligns with state law

Apply standards uniformly to private and city projects

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Fairness and follows Council direction



Design and Implementation Standards

17.57.070 - Area Determination and Planning Factors

Proposed Modification	Reason
Clarify new construction regulation; refine parking area limits; set minimum landscaping standards	Consistency, livability, better site design
Require 1 shade tree per 10 spaces; align tree protection with Ch. 17.58; move prohibited tree list	Environmental benefits, consistency, flexibility
Add measurable screening standards; clarify solid waste/recycling enclosures	Improve design quality and compliance
Defer stormwater facility review; clarify utility landscaping requirements	Avoid duplication, ensure regulatory alignment
Add irrigation self-certification	Simplify process, reduce staff workload



Street Tree Plan Process

17.58.100 Street Tree Plans

Proposed Modification:

 Allows staff to review and approve Street Tree Plans.

Reason:

 Improves efficiency and responsiveness in plan review.



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
