### **Report in Brief:**

The purpose of this work session is to provide the City Council with an update on the McMinnville Programming Advisory Committee (MacPAC). MacPAC is a 19-member committee that was formed in January 2020 to advise the City on library, parks and rec programs and facilities for the future.

MacPAC began meeting in person in February 2020, and after 2 meetings, pivoted to meeting online due to the global pandemic. Over the course of the 17 meetings MacPAC held in 2020 and 2021, the group has discussed the future of programming, physical spaces, amenities, design, equity, and financing options.

At the work session, staff and the MacPAC co-chairs, Meredith Maxfield and Ken Rolfe, will give an overview of the background of the project, what MacPAC has discussed, and what the next steps are before a final recommendation is brought to City Council.
