McMinnville City Finance Director Jennifer Cuellar,

Please consider this a formal complaint against Scott Hill, candidate for McMinnville Mayor. Mr. Hill's PAC name is "Re-Elect Scott Hill Mayor" and his PAC number is 20862. I believe Mr. Hill is in violation of city ordinances 5092 and 5096 that state that "dominant contributors" who contribute over \$1,000 in aggregate contributions should be listed on campaign materials.

Mr. Hill received a contribution in the amount of \$2,500 on 10/5/2020 from the political action committee "Oregonians for Affordable Housing", directly associated with Homebuilders Association of Metropolitan Portland.


Mr. Hill has since produced mailers and electronic, digital ads promoting his campaign (see attached). The digital ads state "Paid for by the Re-Elect Scott Hill Mayor Committee. See our donor list at OreStar.gov". The mailers state the same disclosure and were received in mailboxes on Friday, October 9th.

Not only has Mr. Hill failed to timely report these expenditures within his Orestar account, the city ordinance clearly states that dominant contributors must be listed on printed materials produced within 10 days of the contribution and/or within 5 days of the production of digital ads. It is my understanding that digital ads or electronic communication must also be modified to reflect the dominant contributors to the campaign. The disclosures currently on Mr. Hill's promotional materials do not satisfy the ordinance requirements. Given the amount of time needed to print and mail Mr. Hill's physical mailers, I believe that activity occurred within the 10 day window of receiving the large contribution from Oregonians for Affordable Housing PAC.

I believe Mr. Hill has violated city ordinances and is subject to penalty.
