McMinnville, Or., Aug. 22.—It is expected the contract for building the new Southern Pacific depot will be signed in a few days, as the bid of A. F. Arthur, a local contractor, was accepted by the railroad company. The structure is to be built on the site recently purchased from Mrs. Lydia Hatch on Third street, near the present trackage of the line. The building will be heated by steam and modernly appointed throughout. It will be a frame building with a pressed brick veneer. It is to be 21 feet by 53 feet and will have a shingled roof. The cost is to be approximately \$5000. The building is to be completed within 60 days from the time the contract is signed.
