McMinnville Transportation Bond Oregon Route 99W at 2nd Street Signal Replacement Project



Background

In November, 2014, McMinnville voters passed a \$24 million General Obligation Bond measure for street improvements throughout the City. The proposed improvements include a mix of several needed street corridor

capital projects; pavement overlay and preservation work on the City's "worst condition" streets; and sidewalk and safety improvements. The projects address existing safety and congestion concerns of importance to the City's citizens and businesses along several busy street corridors.

The program consists of seven projects throughout the City:

- Five Capital Improvement Projects to address traffic congestion and improve safety along several street corridors.
- Street Repair and Repaving Projects on portions of 84 City streets.
- Sidewalk and Pedestrian Safety Projects near schools, parks, other public facilities and in the downtown area.

2nd Street

The Oregon Route 99W at 2nd Street Signal Replacement project provides capacity improvements to NE 2nd Street at the signalized intersections with the OR99W couplet. The improvements include providing left-turn lanes between updated traffic signals at the intersections of NE 2nd Street with NE Adams Street and NE Baker Street, as well as





installation of a westbound to northbound right turn on NE 2nd Street at NE Baker St. The project also includes improved sidewalks and crosswalks to promote bike and pedestrian movements.
