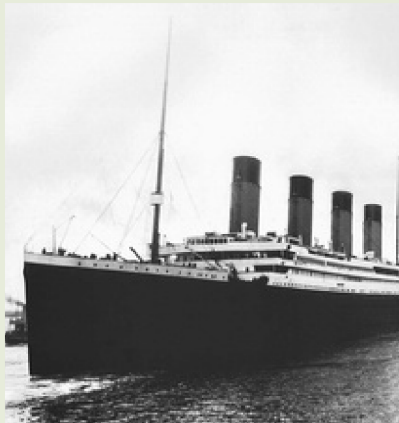

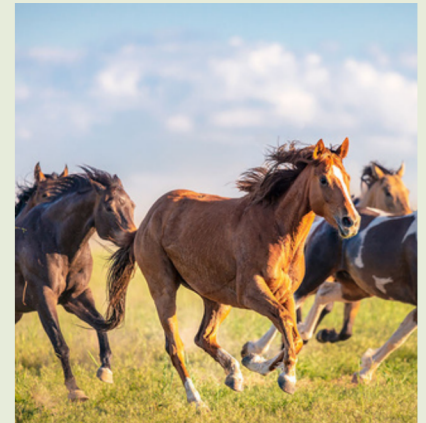


Sunday, April 14th
