## A. Transitional Housing -

- Associate Housing Planner Hietpas presented the Staff report via slideshow presentation, reviewing the Committee's March 2024 discussion on Transitional Housing standards and detailing the proposed Code and zoning amendments. During the presentation, he answered clarifying questions from Committee members.
- The Committee and Staff discussed the proposed amendments, noting which they
  supported as written. Discussion also included whether residential and industrial zones
  are appropriate for transitional housing; requiring types of shelter units that ensure good
  aesthetics; whether to require neighborhood meetings; and facility requirements for pets.
  At the next meeting, Staff would provide more information on shelter unit criteria, heating
  and cooling requirements, zoning allowances, parking requirements, and industrial
  zoning.
