SUBJECT: New Public Testimony for G 7-21, Three Mile Lane Area Plan

Mayor and Councilors,

Typically when we close the public record date specific, the assumption is that the record will close at 5:00 PM on that date as that is the time when the City closes daily operations.

However, we received an email at 11:08 PM on August 15, 2022, from Dave Haugeberg with additional testimony for the public record, and two letters in the mail that were postmarked by August 15, 2022.

Legal counsel reviewed the language of the motion for the public record closure which did not specify a time deadline on August 15, and advised the City that we could proceed within two different paths:

- 1) Maintain the assumption of 5:00 PM as the deadline and not forward the testimony received after that time to the City Council for consideration; or
- 2) Forward the testimony received as the motion for the public record closure was not specific in terms of timeframe.

We are electing to move forward with the second scenario and are advising that in the future the City Council provide not only a date specific for the public record deadline but also a time on that date.

Retail development along SR 18 cannot not "connect" with downtown (presumably 3<sup>rd</sup> Street).

People in McMinnville, just like in every city, purchase items over the internet - to save money, time, and have more selection. No new retail plan can change this.

I shop at Costco in Salem and that's fine because I only go there 3 - 4 times per year. This retailer building a store here would add 5,700 ADP which doesn't thrill me - I moved here from Salem for the small town feel. I work in Sherwood and see that Oregon's transportation department. has done nothing about snarled traffic on 99 between Sherwood and Sunset - there isn't land available to widen roads. LOS is "F" now and falling as more condos crowd in.
